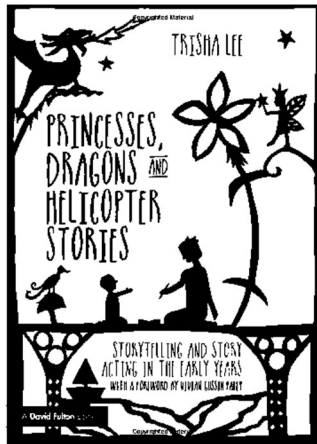

two, three.

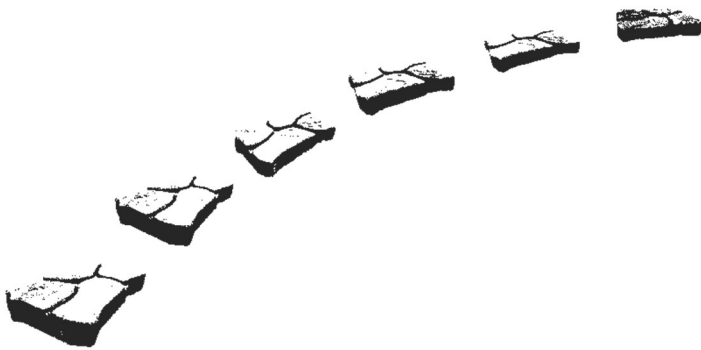
Stepping over stepping stones, come

Popcorn, Popcorn, sizzling in the pan.

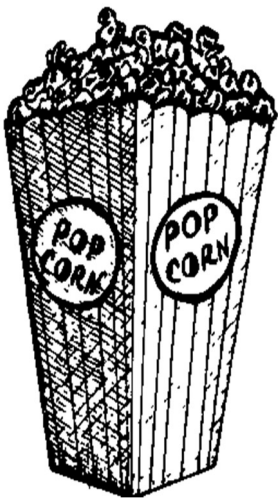
Shake it up, shake it up,

A little wait, and then a flower.



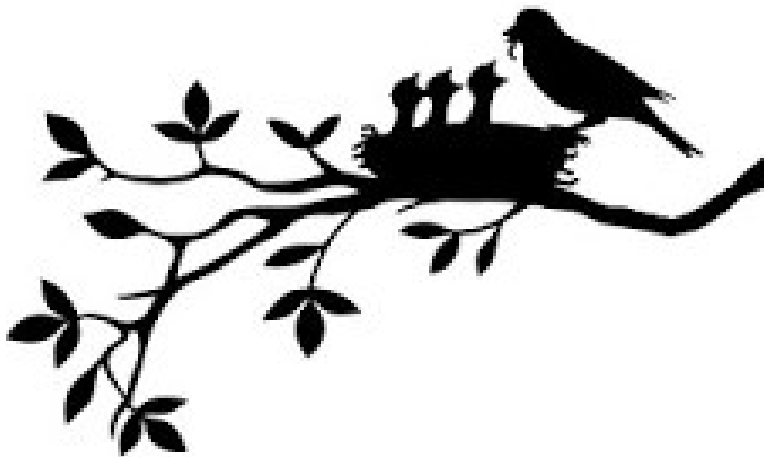
Hungry Birdies

A Little House

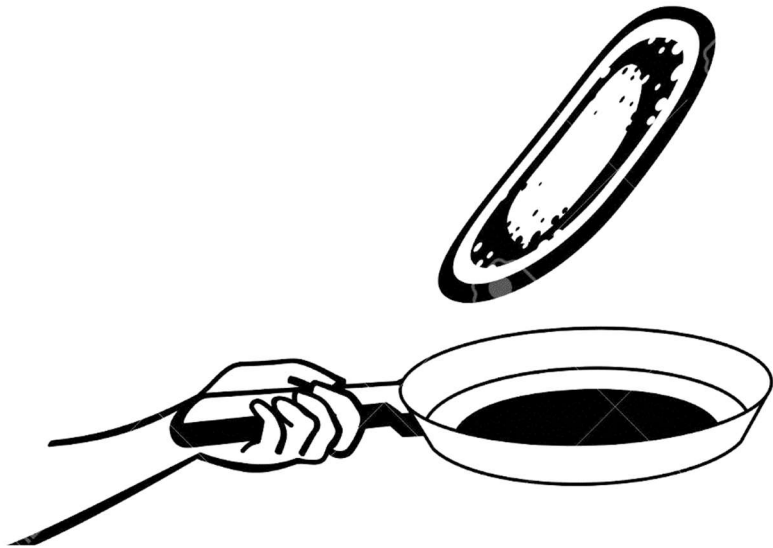
I'm going to build a little house,
