These questions are here to spark conversation over a number of days, but there's no need to ask them all or in any particular order or all at once. Follow the children's lead and see where their ideas take you; explore any further questions that arise from these conversations.

The goal is to encourage imaginative thinking, personal connections, and storytelling. There are no right or wrong answers, Listen to the children's responses, build on their ideas, and let their curiosity guide the discussion.

After you have watched the video for the first time you can always start by asking 'Tell me what you liked about the story.'

If you could turn into a teddy bear for one day, what would you do?



When you are feeling sad, what do people do to cheer you up? What makes you happy again?
